## **Champagne Show of the South**

This year marks the 23rd annual hosting of our Champagne Show of the South Corvette Show. After quite a successful and elaborate show last year, we're trying a slightly different strategy this year. In place of last year's two-day, indoor show, we will be hosting a one-day, outdoor show. The venue we have selected is the Costco at the Riverchase Galleria, and the show will be held Saturday, May 14.

This year, we've selected Magic Moments as our primary beneficiary. Magic Moments is a nonprofit organization dedicated to fulfilling the wishes of chronically ill children throughout Alabama and the surrounding areas, and has been a beneficiary of our shows in the past. Additionally, they usually provide a small army of volunteers, so they will be helping us to help them.

One very big positive I see from the venue change is the fact that we will not have to pay thousands of dollars to rent a facility. Costco is providing the space for us in their large parking lot (which is in a great, high-traffic area, by the way...), and it doesn't look like we'll have to pay a dime for it. This contributes to significantly reducing our overhead which, of course, means that we should still be able to make quite a bit of money for

Magic Moments, despite the single date and venue change. Much thanks to Jocko Lewis and Steven Pope for initiating the Costco relationship — I believe it will greatly benefit us.

I believe we have some great potential this year in the area of large sponsor involvement. We are hoping to bring Serra Chevrolet back as our exclusive dealership sponsor, and Rob Conrad is again working on that. Despite the smaller nature of this show, we believe that a dealership sponsor like Serra can have greater integration with their display and the show cars this year, due to all of the cars (and therefore, crowds) being in one place. Additionally, we are working on bringing such vendors as Mayfield Ice Cream, Coca-Cola and/or Pepsi, and Golden Flake into the fold. Thanks to everyone's efforts to boost our sponsorship revenue! Also, I'd like to thank Donna Allen for agreeing to handle registration this year. I hope we'll have lots of interested people to keep her busy!

Many additional details are being worked on at the present time by the Show Committee, which includes Rob Conrad, Jocko Lewis, and Chris & Suzan Touchton. As we have more information, we will share it with you. We will soon be asking for volunteers to help out as "department heads," and we'll need additional people under them to help with specific tasks. ### **Z06 Build Update – GM Corvette Assembly Plant**

The last car in the first manufacturing validation build (MVB) came off line on Wednesday, February 15. This is the last of the five Z06s in the first MVB. There are two more MVBs scheduled, each one consisting of five cars. The first Z06 in the next MVB started in body shop on Monday, February 21. Stay tuned for more information.

### **New Corvette Engine Shatters Previous OHV RPM Limits**

GM engineers have achieved a feat many speculated was not possible. The new LS7 7.0-liter OHV (overhead valve) V-8 engine for the 2006 Z06 Corvette will not only achieve 500 horsepower but will be capable of running up to 7100 rpm. The previous limit was 6600 rpm in the 6.0-liter LS2. With this new engine GM is showing multi-valve overhead cam performance is achievable with a two-valve cam-in-block engine. For the new Z06, higher rpm allows the driver to remain in first gear to just over 60 mph, contributes to higher top speed and improves overall vehicle performance. The LS7 is one of the first automotive OHV production engines in the industry capable of over 7000 rpm. The new Z06's sub four-second 0-60 mph time is achieved in part by the extended rpm range and the ability to

remain in first gear past 60 mph. The over-190 top speed of the ZO6 is partially due to the speed capability of the engine.

### **Mark Kent Named Director of GM Racing**

General Motors has named Mark Kent as the new director of racing. Kent will oversee engineering and marketing activities for all of GM's motorsports programs, including NASCAR, NHRA, SCCA, Grand American, American Le Mans and IRL. Kent, 44, replaces Doug Duchardt, who held the position for the last two years. Kent has experience in powertrain development both for production and race vehicles. From 1987 to 1992, he held motorsports engineering and program manager positions for winning IMSA GTU and SCCA Trans Am programs. Most recently, he was the GM Powertrain design systems engineer for the Northstar V-8 line-up of engines. "Our racing efforts will benefit from Mark's motorsports engineering and program management experience and his competitive nature," said Steve Shannon, executive director of GM Marketing Services. "He has a strong track record of leading and supporting successful racing programs for the company." Kent takes the reins to GM's extensive motorsports program on March 1, 2005.
